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SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNINGS



WARNING! Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. *Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.*

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference. *The term “power tool” in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery operated (cordless) power tool.”*

WORK AREA SAFETY

- a. **Keep work area clean and well lit.** *Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.*
- b. **Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust.** *Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.*
- c. **Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool.** *Distractions can cause you to lose control.*

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- a. **Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools.** *Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.*
- b. **Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators.** *There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.*

- c. **Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions.** *Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.*
- d. **Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts.** *Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.*
- e. **When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use.** *Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.*
- f. **If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply.** *Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.*

PERSONAL SAFETY

- a. **Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication.** *A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.*
- b. **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** *Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat, or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.*
- c. **Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off- position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool.** *Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.*
- d. **Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on.** *A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.*
- e. **Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** *This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.*

- f. **Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair, clothing away from moving parts.** *Loose clothes, jewellery or longhair can be caught in moving parts.*
- g. **If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used.** *Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.*
- h. **Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles.** *A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.*

POWER TOOL USE AND CARE

- a. **Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application.** *The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.*
- b. **Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.** *Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.*
- c. **Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools.** *Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.*
- d. **Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.** *Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.*
- e. **Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tools operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use.** *Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.*

- f. **Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.** *Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control*
- g. **Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed.** *Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.*
- h. **Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease.** *Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.*

BATTERY TOOL USE AND CARE

- a. **Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer.** *A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.*
- b. **Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs.** *Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.*
- c. **When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another.** *Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.*
- d. **Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help.** *Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.*
- e. **Do not use battery pack or tool that is damaged or modified.** *Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of*

injury.

- f. Do not expose a battery pack or tool to fire or excessive temperature.** *Exposure to fire or temperature above 130 °C may cause explosion.*
- g. Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions.** *Charging improperly or at temperatures outside the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.*

SERVICE

- a. Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts.** *This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.*
- b. Never service damaged battery packs.** *Service of battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service providers.*

ADDITIONAL SAFETY WARNINGS FOR CORDLESS BELT SANDER

- a.** *Harmful/Toxic dusts will arise from sanding e.g. lead painted surfaces, woods and metals. Contact with or inhalation of these dusts can endanger the health of operator and bystanders. Always use eye glasses and dust mask.*
- b.** *Hearing protection should be worn when using the sander.*
- c.** *Always wear safety glasses or eye shields when using the sander. Everyday eyeglasses have only impact-resistant lenses; they are not safety glasses. Following this rule will reduce the risk of serious personal injury.*
- d.** *After long working periods external metal parts and accessories could be hot.*
- e.** *If possible, ensure the work-piece is firmly clamped to prevent movement.*
- f.** *Your sander is a hand held tool, do not clamp your sander.*

- g. Before sanding, check the area is free of nails, screws, etc.*
- h. Never stop the sander by applying a force to the base plate.*
- i. Only use sanding belt in good condition. Do not use torn or worn sanding belt.*
- j. Do not sand material containing asbestos due to a health risk.*
- k. Do not sand lead based paint due to the risk of lead poisoning.*
- l. Do not eat or drink in the working area of the sander.*
- m. Do not allow people to enter the working area without wearing a dust mask.*
- n. Where possible, seal off the working area to contain the dust for later removal.*
- o. Your tool is designed for dry sanding only, not wet sanding.*
- p. Do not sand magnesium material due to the risk of fire.*
- q. Whenever possible, use separate dust extraction (vacuum) to help keep the area free of dust.*
- r. Always use provided dust bag (except for sanding metal) if separate dust extraction is not possible.*

ADDITIONAL SAFETY WARNINGS FOR BATTERY

- a. Do not connect the positive terminal and negative terminal of the battery to each other with any metal object (such as wire).*
- b. Do not carry or store battery together with necklaces, hairpins or other metal objects.*
- c. Do not pierce the battery with nails, strike the battery with a hammer, step on the battery or otherwise subject it to strong impacts or shocks.*
- d. Do not solder directly onto the battery.*
- e. Do not expose battery to water or salt water, or allow the battery to get wet.*
- f. Do not disassemble or modify the battery.*

- g. Do not place the battery in or near fire, on stoves or other high temperature locations. Do not place the battery in direct sunlight, or use or store the battery inside cars in hot weather.*
- h. Do not place the battery in microwave ovens, high-pressure containers or on induction cookware.*
- i. If you intend to store a battery for a period without use then store battery at room temperature (19°C to 25°C), charged to about 30 – 50% of capacity. When storing for very long periods boost charge the battery once per year to prevent over discharge.*

The following information applies to professional users only but is good practice for all users:

ADDITIONAL SAFETY WARNING FOR CONSTRUCTION DUST

The updated Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations 1st October 2012 now also targets to reduce the risks associated with silica, wood and gypsumdusts. Construction workers are one of the at-risk groups within this because of the dust that they breathe: silica dust is not just a nuisance; it is a real risk to your lungs!

Silica is a natural mineral present in large amounts in things like sand, sandstone and granite. It is also commonly found in many construction materials such as concrete and mortar. The silica is broken into very fine dust (also known as Respirable Crystalline Silica or RCS) during many common tasks such as cutting, drilling and grinding. Breathing in very fine particles of crystalline silica can lead to the development of: Lung cancer Silicosis Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disorder/Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and breathing in fine particles of wood dust can lead to the development of Asthma. The risk of lung disease is linked to people who regularly breathe construction dust over a period of time, not on the odd occasion.

To protect the lung, the COSHH Regulations sets a limit on the amount of these dusts that you can breathe (called a Workplace Exposure Limit or WEL) when averaged over a normal working day. These limits are not a large amount of dust: when compared to a penny it is tiny – like a small pinch of salt: This limit is the legal maximum; the most you can breathe after the right controls have been used.

HOW TO REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF DUST?

1. Reduce the amount of cutting by using the best sizes of building products. Use a less powerful e.g. a block cutter instead of angle grinder.
2. Using a different method of work altogether – e.g. using a nail gun to direct fasten cable trays instead of drilling holes first.
3. Please always work with approved safety equipment, such as those dust masks that specially designed to filter out microscopic particles and use the dust extraction facility at all time.

WARNING! Some dust particles created by power sanding, sawing, grinding, drilling and other construction jobs contain chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. Some examples of these chemicals are:

- Lead from lead-based paint
- Crystalline silica from bricks and cement and other masonry products
- Arsenic and chromium from chemically treated timber
- Your risk from these exposures varies, depending upon how often you do this type of work. To reduce your exposure to these chemicals:
- Work in a well-ventilated area.
- Work with approved safety equipment, such as those dust masks that are specially designed to filter microscopic particles.

VIBRATION

The European Physical Agents (Vibration) Directive has been brought in to help reduce hand arm vibration syndrome injuries to power tool users. The directive requires power tool manufacturers and suppliers to provide indicative vibration test results to enable users to make informed decisions as to the period of time a power tool can be used safely on a daily basis and the choice of tool.

SEE TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS IN THE INSTRUCTION MANUAL FOR THE VIBRATION LEVELS OF YOUR TOOL.

The declared vibration emission value should be used as a minimum level and should be use with the current guidance on vibration.

Calculating the actual period of use can be difficult and the HSE website has further information.

While working with this power tool, hand/arm vibrations occur.

Adopt the correct working practices in order to reduce the exposure to vibration. This tool may cause hand-arm vibration syndrome if its use is not adequately managed.

Helping to minimise your vibration exposure risk. ALWAYS use sharp chisels, drills and blades. Maintain this tool in accordance with these instructions and keep well lubricated (where appropriate). Avoid using tools in temperatures of 10°C or less. Plan your work schedule to spread any high vibration tool use across a number of days.



NOTE: The use of other tools will reduce the users' total working period on this tool.

HEALTH SURVEILLANCE

All employees should be part of an employer's health surveillance scheme to help identify any vibration related diseases at an early stage, prevent disease progression and help employees stay in work.

RESIDUAL RISKS

Even if you are operating this product in accordance with all the safety requirements, potential risks of injury and damage remain. The following dangers can arise in connection with the structure and design of this product:

1. Injuries and damage to property due to broken attachments or the sudden impact of hidden objects during use.
2. Danger of injury and property damage caused by flying objects or poor power tool accessories.

02 UNPACKING

Unpack all parts and lay them on a flat, stable surface.

- Remove all packing materials and shipping devices, if applicable.

03 ASSEMBLING THE MACHINE

CHARGING YOUR BATTERY PACK







The battery has been shipped in a low charge condition. Charge it fully before first use. Refer to the charger instruction manual for the details.

TO REMOVE OR INSTALL THE BATTERY PACK (A1, A2)

Depress the battery pack release button to release and slide the battery pack out from your tool. After recharge, slide it back into your tool. A simple push and slight pressure will be sufficient.

BATTERY PACK POWER BAR

The Li-Ion battery pack (8) is equipped with a POWER BAR which is used to give an indication of the battery pack's remaining charge. Press the POWER BAR button (6) to check battery charge as below. The LED will stay lit for approximately 5 seconds.

WARNING! To prevent accidental starting that could cause serious personal injury, always remove the battery pack(s) from the product when assembling parts or making any adjustments.

ADJUSTING THE FRONT HANDLE (B)

The front handle (1) can be adjusted to 4 positions.

Turn the front handle adjustment knob (2) anticlockwise to loosen the front handle (1).

Adjust the front handle (1) to one of the three operating positions so that you can hold the product safely and securely during operation.

Turn the front handle adjustment knob (2) clockwise to secure the front handle.

SANDING BELT (C)

Choosing the right sanding belt

Sanding belts are available with different grain sizes (grit). The grain size is indicated with a number on the reverse of the sanding belt, the higher the number the finer the grain size.

coarse	<P100	removal of paint and varnish, preparation of rough surfaces
fine	>P180	finishing, cleaning plaster and water stain from wood.

Only use suitable sanding belts in terms of application and size.

Replace worn or damaged sanding belts immediately.

Start with a coarse sanding belt and finish with a fine-grained one to achieve a satisfactory result.

Do not use the same sanding belt on different materials, e.g. do not use the sanding belt that has been used for sanding metal to sand wood. Small metal particles remaining in the sanding belt will lead to scratches.

Attaching the sanding belt

Place the sander on its side and pull the clamp lever (13) outward.

Pay attention to the rotation direction indicated on the inside of the sanding belt (15). Align the sanding belt (15) in accordance with the direction arrow (11) indicated on the product housing and slide it over the front roller (14) and drive roller (12).

Press the clamp lever (13) back in. Slightly pull the sanding belt (15) to test if it sits properly in place.

Adjusting belt position

Hold the product tight and press the on/off switch (10) then release it. The belt rotates for a short period to be centered automatically through the auto belt tracking system.

Rotate the adjusting screw (17) to fine adjust the belt if necessary.

Rotating the adjusting screw (17) counterclockwise will cause the front roller (14) to tilt toward the bottom plate, and the sand belt (15) will now travel away from the sander.

Rotating the adjusting screw (17) clockwise will cause the front roller (14) to tilt toward the front of the tool, and the sand belt (15) will now travel toward the sander.



NOTE: Refer to “Product functions / Operation” for more information about operating this product!

Removing/Replacing

Pull the clamp lever (13) outward and remove the sanding belt (15).

Attach a new sanding belt as required.

DUST EXTRACTION (D1, D2)

Attaching/Removing the dust bag

Align the slot on the dust bag (5) to the dust extraction outlet on the belt sander, and attach it all the way to the stop.

To remove the dust bag (5), pull the dust bag off the tool.



WARNING! Empty the dust bag frequently during use, after completion of sanding, and before storing the sander. Be extremely careful of dust disposal; materials in fine particle form may be explosive. Do not throw sanding dust on an open fire. Combustion form mixture of varnishes, lacquers, polyurethane, oil, or water with dust particles can occur if there is a static discharge, spark introduced in the bag, or excessive heat.

WARNING! Do not use the dust bag when sanding metal! The hot metal particles could cause residual wood dust or the bag itself to catch fire!

Connecting the dust extraction system

Alternatively a dust extraction system or suitable vacuum cleaner can be connected to the dust extraction outlet by the vacuum adaptor (16) for a cleaner and safer work area.



USE

01 INTENDED USE

This tool is intended for dry sanding of wood, plastic, metal, fillers as well as varnished surfaces.

02 OPERATION

SPEED DIAL (E)

Adjust the tool speed by using the speed dial (3).

The speed dial (3) is numbered “1” to “6”, with position “1” being the lowest speed and position “6” being the highest speed.

A higher setting is suitable for sanding with fine-grained sanding belts to achieve a fine finishing. A lower setting is suitable for sanding with coarse-grained sanding belts to remove paints and varnishes.

ON / OFF SWITCH (F)

Operate the tool either in instant or continuous mode.

Instant mode

Switch the tool on by pressing the on/off switch (10).

Switch the tool off by releasing the on/off switch (10).

Continuous mode

Switch the tool on by pressing the on/off switch (10) and hold it in position.

Press the lock-on button (4) to lock the on/off switch (10). The on/off switch is now locked on for continuous use.

Depress and release the on/off switch (10) to switch the tool off.

SANDING (G)

Ensure that the air vents are always unobstructed and clear. Clean them if necessary with a soft brush. Blocked air vents may lead to overheating and damage the product.

Always hold the tool on its gripping surfaces. Keep the gripping surfaces dry to ensure safe support.

Switch the product on and wait until it runs at full speed before placing it on the workpiece.

Only apply as much pressure as necessary to keep the product flat on the workpiece. Higher pressure will not increase but lower the performance of the product and leads to uneven results.

Keep the product moving at all times, do not stop in one position to avoid grooves.

Switch the tool off immediately if you are disturbed while working by other people

entering the working area. Always let the product come to complete stop before putting it down.



NOTE: The product is equipped with an auto belt tracking system, which will keep the belt centered automatically.

OVERLOAD, TEMPERATURE AND CHARGING PROBLEM

Problem	Tool/ Battery Status	Possible cause	Solution
Overload protection	Product suddenly Stops; The LED work light (if fitted) is flashing	Extremely high torque, binding and stalling situations, overloading of the tool	Relieve the load immediately, reset the tool by switching off and back on again
Temperature extremely high	The first and the third LED light of the POWER BAR will be flashing alternately	Battery temperature exceeds 77°C during operation	Cool down the battery to below 77°C for operation and below 57°C for charging
Low charge	Power for the tool will drop quickly; The first LED on the POWER BAR begins to flash	The battery pack is under 5% charge	Remove the battery pack from the tool and charge it
Other problems	Short charges	Not fully charged	Make sure that the battery is fully charged every time by allowing the charger to complete its full charging cycle
		Poor storage condition	Always remove battery from the tool and charger when not in use and store in a dry secure place. Avoid charging or storing your battery in temperatures below 5°C and above 40°C. Cool down a hot battery pack from a tool that has just been operated for approximately 30 minutes before storage



CARE & MAINTENANCE

MAINTENANCE

Your tool requires no additional lubrication or maintenance. There are no user serviceable parts in your power tool. Never use water or chemical cleaners to clean your power tool. Wipe clean with a dry cloth. Always store your power tool in a dry place. Keep the motor ventilation slots clean. Keep all working controls free of dust.

RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL



Waste electrical products should not be disposed of with household waste.

DISPOSAL OF AN EXHAUSTED BATTERY PACK



To preserve natural resources, please recycle or dispose of the battery pack properly. This battery pack contains Li-Ion batteries. Consult your local waste authority for information regarding available recycling and/or disposal options. Discharge your battery pack by operating your tool, then remove the battery pack from the tool housing and cover the battery pack connections with heavy-duty adhesive tape to prevent short circuit and energy discharge. Do not attempt to open or remove any of the components.

REPAIR

This product does not contain any parts that can be repaired by the consumer. Contact an authorised service centre or a similarly qualified person to have it checked and repaired.

STORAGE

- Switch the product off and remove the battery pack.
- Clean the product as described above.
- Store the product and its accessories in a dark, dry, frost-free, well-ventilated place.
- Always store the product in a place that is inaccessible to children.
- We recommend using the original package for storage or covering the product with a suitable cloth or enclosure to protect it against dust.

TRANSPORTATION

- Switch the product off and remove the battery pack.
- Attach transportation guards, if applicable.
- Always carry the product by its handle.
- Protect the product from any heavy impact or strong vibrations which may occur during transportation in vehicles.
- Secure the product to prevent it from slipping or falling over.



GUARANTEE

We take special care to select high quality materials and use manufacturing techniques that allow us to create products incorporating design and durability.
